Follow our sculpture trail

Hucking Estate is home to some fantastic chainsaw sculptures by local artists Nick Speakman and Rob Dyer. Follow the Landscape Trail (look out for the waymarkers) to discover a family of wild boar, a giant axe, a detailed habitat log and an impressive shepherd with his dog.

Find the majestic beech tree

A huge beech tree, believed to be 200 years old, stands on an old field boundary next to the Woodland Trust car park. In winter months it is particularly striking, its bare branches standing out starkly against the sky.

For children

Snowmen and twig towers

If there's snow on the ground, build your own woodland snowman or snow animal. Use twigs to give your creation features. If there's no snow, build a twig tower sculpture instead. Build a strong base then see how tall you can make it.
